What Are Index Funds & Why Buy the Whole Haystack?

Key Concepts at a Glance

- **Index:** A list of companies that represents a specific market, such as the UK or global stock market.
- **Index Fund:** A fund that invests in all or most of the companies in an index.
- **Diversification:** Spreading your investment across many companies to reduce risk.
- **Core Idea:** Buying the whole market is often more effective than trying to pick individual winning stocks.

A Simple Example

Instead of investing in one company, you invest in a fund that owns hundreds or thousands of companies.

If one company performs poorly, others may perform well. This balance helps smooth out returns over time. This is why index funds are often described as “buying the whole haystack” rather than searching for the perfect stock.
